THE CONTENDERS



The 34th edition of the FIBA Intercontinental Cup consolidates Singapore as the host of the event and completes the process that has seen the competition evolve into a truly global phenomenon.

In 2022, the field of contenders grew to include clubs from Africa for the first time, in 2023 it added Asian clubs and expanded to six teams, and this year it will include Oceania, in another historical first.

From September 12-15, the fortunate spectators in Singapore Indoor Stadium will witness the first club basketball competition in history to feature teams from six different continents.

Each of these six teams will take to the court hoping to conquer the FIBA Intercontinental Cup trophy for the first time in their history. No matter which geographical region's representative wins in 2024, we will have a first-time winner.

In fact, Argentina's Quimsa are the only ones in this company to have competed in the FIBA Intercontinental Cup before, in 2021, but the coveted crown eluded them.

These are the six contenders, drawn into two groups:

GROUP A

UNICAJA - SPAIN - Winner of Basketball Champions League Europe

PETRO DE LUANDA - ANGOLA - Winner of Basketball Africa League

AL RIYADI BEIRUT - LEBANON - Winner of Basketball Champions League Asia

GROUP B

QUIMSA - ARGENTINA - Winner of Basketball Champions League Americas

NBA G LEAGUE UNITED - USA - NBA G League United representative

TASMANIA JACKJUMPERS - AUSTRALIA - Winner of National Basketball League

Each team will play two games (against the other two teams in their group) during the Group Phase. On September 15, the two teams that won their respective groups will square off in the Final for the title. The second-placed teams in each group will face off in the Third-Place Game, while the third-placed teams in each group will do battle for fifth place in the tournament.

THE VENUE

SINGAPORE INDOOR STADIUM

Designed by internationally acclaimed architect Kenzo Tange and officially declared open by Singapore's first Prime Minister, Lee Kuan Yew, this air-conditioned, multi-purpose pillarless sports and entertainment facility has hosted a wide variety of sports, entertainment and community events.

With flexible configuration for maximum utilization of event space, it can accommodate from 4,000 to 12,000 spectators.

Stephon Marbury has had a storied career that spans continents and left an indelible mark on the sport. Hailing from Brooklyn, New York, Marbury burst onto the NBA scene as a dynamic point guard known for his lightning-quick drives and exceptional court vision. Over a 13-year NBA career, Marbury was a two-time All-Star and earned a reputation as one of the most skilled playmakers of his era, playing for teams such as the Minnesota Timberwolves, New Jersey Nets, and New York Knicks.

Marbury represented his nation at the highest level, as a member of the USA team that clinched the bronze medal at the 2004 Athens Olympics.

However, it was his transformative journey to China that solidified his legacy as a global basketball icon. Joining the Beijing Ducks in 2011, he led the team to three Chinese Basketball Association (CBA) championships, becoming a beloved figure in Chinese sports culture. Marbury's impact transcended the court, as he embraced his role as a cultural ambassador, earning the nickname 'Coney Island's Finest' while being immortalized with a statue in Beijing.

Marbury's passion for bridging cultures through sport makes him an ideal FIBA Intercontinental Cup ambassador, with his career a testament to the global appeal of basketball.

AL RIYADI BEIRUT



Al Riyadi means 'the sporting club' in Arabic, but a more accurate name for the most decorated club in Lebanon, and one of the most dominant in the whole of Asia, would have been 'the champion'.

The Beirut club was founded in 1934 and started turning into an unstoppable winning machine after 1950, conquering the national league title on 31 occasions.

Al Riyadi lifted their first FIBA Asia Champions Cup in 2011, followed up with a second success in 2017, and they were more than ready to taste success when the competition was rebranded as Basketball Champions League Asia in 2024.

They were proclaimed champions of the inaugural BCL Asia in June, capping off their unbeaten run to the title with a triumph over Shabab Al Ahli in the Final. Superstar guard Wael Arakji was named MVP for his phenomenal performances throughout the competition, including a 31-point, 9-assist showing in the championship game.

The Lebanese international has collected numerous awards over his career, just like Al Riyadi have collected titles., The FIBA Intercontinental Cup nonetheless represents an entirely new challenge for everyone at the Beirut club, as this is only the second year in competition history that a team from Asia is taking part.

The NBA G League United are the undisputed winners of the 2024 FIBA Intercontinental Cup's first, albeit unofficial, title: the most intriguing team in this year's competition.

That's because the G League United is an entirely new team, established in 2024, and comprising select prospects and stars who will represent the NBA G League in domestic and international competitions.

This new team therefore picks up the baton from Team Ignite, who represented the NBA G League last year in the first ever FIBA Intercontinental Cup to be hosted in Singapore.

Paul Hewitt, the San Diego Clippers head coach who has vast previous experience in the NCAA and the USA youth national team program, has been entrusted with coaching the G League United in Singapore.

Japan international Keisei Tominaga and Juan Toscano-Anderson, a 2022 NBA champion with the Golden State Warriors, headline the roster at coach Hewitt's disposal and lead a great mix of seasoned veterans and young talent.

The Rio Grande Valley Vipers and the Lakeland Magic, who finished third in 2023 and 2022, respectively, are the only NBA G League teams so far to have celebrated victories in the FIBA Intercontinental Cup.

PETRO DE LUANDA



When Angola's Petro de Luanda lifted the Basketball Africa League title in June, they made history as the first Sub-Saharan club to claim the trophy. Their success however was hardly surprising.

Petro de Luanda had been building methodically toward that moment, having won the FIBA Africa Champions Cup (the predecessor of the BAL) on two occasions and dominating their domestic league with an iron fist since 2019, with their total championship tally rising to 17.

The Angolan champions' defeat in the 2022 BAL Final, the first time they reached the title game, was merely a blip. Spanish head coach Sergio Valdeolmillos, a former coach of the Mexican national team, took the reins of the team in March and helped push Petro de Luanda to the top of the podium at the second try.

The core of the roster who carried Petro de Luanda to their BAL triumph is present in Singapore, headlined by Nick Faust, who led the side in scoring in the Final with 24 points, and Angolan internationals Yanick Moreira, Cleusio Castro and Childe Dundao.

When they take to the court in Singapore on September 12 they will make history again, as the first Sub-Saharan team - and only the fourth from Africa - to compete in the FIBA Intercontinental Cup.

It's been only 18 years since Quimsa ascended to the top flight of Argentinian basketball, yet the team representing the city of Santiago del Estero has already put together a trophy room that would be the envy of many a historic club.

Quimsa have collected both domestic and continental silverware, with their two Basketball Champions League Americas titles, in 2020 and 2024, shining the brightest. They are the only club to have won that continental competition twice, collecting the second crown last April, after they defeated Brazil's Flamengo in the Final.

Star point guard Juan Brussino, who was included on the BCL Americas All-Star 5, is one of several players from that championship team to continue at Quimsa this season.

The BCL Americas triumph earned them the trip to Singapore and the chance to capture the only trophy to have eluded the club so far - Quimsa played in the FIBA Intercontinental Cup Final in 2021, but fell to Spain's Hereda San Pablo Burgos.

If the 2024 iteration of Quimsa manages to take care of unfinished business, it will be in great part thanks to Head Coach Leandro Ramella, the man with the magic touch. Since taking the reins in 2023, he's steered the club to wins in the Argentinian League, Cup and Supercup, in addition of course to their BCL Americas triumph.

TASMANIA JACKJUMPERS



The reigning NBL champions represent the latest addition to the FIBA Intercontinental Cup, Oceania, but there is one more reason everyone in Singapore is looking at the Tasmania JackJumpers like a shiny new thing.

Founded as recently as 2020, the Tasmanian side are the youngest club to ever take part in the FIBA Intercontinental Cup, in addition to being the first ever Australian club to do so.

Their meteoric rise through the NBL ranks saw them win the championship in March 2024, in what was only their third campaign in the league.

The young guns owe a lot to a 61-year-old American, head coach Scott Roth. After a playing career that took him to various stops in the NBA and Europe, Roth had long stints in the coaching staff at the Dallas Mavericks, Vancouver/Memphis Grizzlies and Toronto Raptors, among others.

Coach Roth can count with a big part of the squad that won the NBL title last March, including veteran point guard Jordon Crawford, Australian international Will Magnay and fan favorite Milton Doyle, who led the team in scoring, rebounds and assists, respectively during last year's campaign.

A roster laden with experience, including internationally, and a coach with a resumé spanning three continents ensure the occasion in Singapore will not be too big for this new kid on the block.

Unicaja came close to completing a dream season in 2023-24, as they finished atop the Spanish league's regular season standings, ahead of giants Real Madrid, and lifted their first ever Basketball Champions League trophy.

The Malaga club went on however to lose in the play-offs and did not get to add a second Spanish championship to their trophy case. Their BCL title nonetheless earned them the right to challenge for their first ever FIBA Intercontinental Cup - and the honor of bringing back the crown to Europe, after two years.

Unicaja counts with largely the same roster that almost realised the dream a few months ago, simply injecting it with three new frontcourt players, in Aleksander Balcerowski, Tyson Perez and Killian Tillie.

The new arrivals haven't had enough time to settle into head coach Ibon Navarro's system, but the Spanish play-caller has been at the helm since 2022 and the rest of the roster are by now perfectly immersed into his philosophy and reflect it on the court.

It's not so much about the tactical schemes, it's more about the approach to the game - and to winning - under Navarro. That is why Unicaja will come out in Singapore firing at all cylinders, fully focused on bringing back that beautiful silverware.

MEDIA ACCREDITATION AND TRIBUNE SEATING

- All accredited media and photographers will be able to collect their media accreditation passes and photographer bibs at the Accreditation Centre (Sports Hub Library) during the opening hours above.
- Media are required to carry their accreditation at all times, for entry into the media zones (Media Tribune, Mixed Zone). Accredited media who fail to produce their pass be denied entry.

- Non-rights holders will be allowed to film during the following occasions:

 - award ceremony
 - press conference after the Final

MEDIA ACTIVITIES

GAME ACCESS AND GUIDELINES FOR ACCREDITED PHOTOGRAPHERS

- Accredited photographers can only take photos from the photo benches around the court. These positions are offered on a first come, first served basis.
- Under no circumstances can photographers venture behind the team benches or on the court at any stage, before, during or after the game.
- Photographers are kindly requested to not mark or add self-made stickers to reserve positions at the photo benches.
- They must take their position before the game starts, they cannot move during the game but only during the half time interval.
- Photographers can shoot from the stands but should be mindful not to obstruct the view of spectators and Host Broadcasting cameras.
- Photographers cannot film live or record video of any action inside the arena bowl at all times, including live game action.
- Photographers should be mindful of their camera equipment positioning to ensure the safety of participants and surrounding spectators.
- Photography taken by accredited photographers may be published (including online) for editorial purposes only.

TEAM PRACTICE SESSIONS

By default, all team practices throughout the tournament are considered closed sessions. However the last five (5) minutes of each of the sessions must be open for photo and video opportunity.

The 10 minutes after the end of each practice are considered Media Minutes when media can approach the players and coaches for interviews.

Interviews must be conducted in the mixed zone, in order not to distract the next team practice..

The official practice schedule will be communicated through media advisories.
