# THE CONTENDERS



The 35th edition of the FIBA Intercontinental Cup consolidates Singapore as the host of the event and completes the process that has seen the competition evolve into a truly global phenomenon.

In 2022, the field of contenders grew to include clubs from Africa for the first time, in 2023 it added Asian clubs and expanded to six teams, and since 2024 it includes Oceania, too, in another historical first.

From September 18-21, the fortunate spectators in Singapore Indoor Stadium will witness the Spanish giants Unicaja trying to become the first team to defend their FIBA Intercontinental Cup title since Real Madrid won three straight from 1976 to 1978.

Their job will not be easy, as they face teams from all the other geographical regions, including the champions from other respective Basketball Champions League competitions, the Australian National Basketball League winners, the Basketball Africa League title holders and the select team from the NBA G League.

These are the six contenders, drawn into two groups:

## GROUP A

**ALAHLI SC** - LIBYA - Winner of Basketball Africa League

**UNICAJA** - SPAIN - Winner of Basketball Champions League Europe

**UTSUNOMIYA BREX** - JAPAN - Winner of Basketball Champions League Asia

## GROUP B

**FLAMENGO** - BRAZIL - Winner of Basketball Champions League Americas

**ILLAWARRA HAWKS** - AUSTRALIA - Winner of National Basketball League

**NBA G LEAGUE UNITED** - USA - NBA G League United representative

Each team will play two games (against the other two teams in their group) during the Group Phase. On September 21, the two teams that won their respective groups will square off in the Final for the title.

The second-placed teams in each group will face off in the Third-Place Game, while the third-placed teams in each group will battle for fifth place in the tournament.

# THE VENUE

## SINGAPORE INDOOR STADIUM

Singapore Indoor Stadium Designed by internationally acclaimed architect Kenzo Tange and officially declared open by Singapore's first Prime Minister, Lee Kuan Yew, this air-conditioned, multi-purpose pillarless sports and entertainment facility has hosted a wide variety of sports, entertainment and community events. With flexible configuration for maximum utilization of event space, it can accommodate from 4,000 to 12,000 spectators.

The role of the Ambassador is ideal for somebody with Ronny Turiaf's curriculum vitae. An international winner on all levels, the big guy had one of his finest moments already as a 17-year-old, scoring the incredible game-winning layup to get France gold at the FIBA U18 EuroBasket 2000, stunning 4,000 Croatian fans in Zadar, and giving the French golden generation an explosive start to their careers.

They went on to win medals in all major competitions, led by Tony Parker and Boris Diaw, while Ronny could not stop winning on club level, either, whether he was Kobe Bryant's teammate on the LA Lakers, or it was helping LeBron James, Dwyane Wade, Chris Bosh and the Miami Heat claim the NBA championship in 2012. The center played in more than 500 NBA games throughout his career, getting his minutes with the Heat, the Lakers, plus Golden State Warriors, New York Knicks, Washington Wizards, Los Angeles Clippers and Minnesota Timberwolves.

Being the Ambassador is not related only to on-court success. A beloved figure off the court, too, Turiaf set up the Heart to Heart Foundation, providing medical care to children who do not have health insurance and cannot afford the care they need.

Another giant taking on the role of the Ambassador, Pero Antic was a career journeyman. The North Macedonian played club basketball in his homeland, then moved to Greece, Serbia, Bulgaria, Russia, the United States and Türkiye.

His most famous moments came as a member of the Atlanta Hawks from 2013 to 2015, appearing in more than 100 Regular Season games, and 22 NBA Playoffs games, culminating in the Eastern Conference Finals series against LeBron James and the Cleveland Cavaliers in 2015.

Antic had a brilliant club career in Europe, too, picking up three EuroLeague titles, two with the Greek club Olympiacos, and another with Fenerbahce from Türkiye, while also winning an incredible 13 domestic trophies throughout his 19-year long career.

However, Pero's proudest moments came with the national team. With North Macedonia, he created one of the biggest upsets in FIBA EuroBasket history, reaching the Semi-Finals in Lithuania in 2011.

Since retiring from basketball, he was working as an assistant coach for the Phoenix Suns and served as the President of the Basketball Federation of North Macedonia.

A fan of tattoos, Antic's body is covered in ink, with the family motives, but also his nation's flag on his chest, and the emblem of his favorite ultras, Crvena Zvezda's fans Delije from Belgrade, Serbia.

Egypt, Tunisia, Angola, and now – Libya. A warm welcome to the fourth different African nation to take part in the FIBA Intercontinental Cup, following Zamalek and Al Ahly from Egypt, US Monastir from Tunisia and Petro de Luanda from Angola.

To make the connection stronger, it was the team from Angola which stood in Alahli SC's way to the FIBA Intercontinental Cup 2025. The two teams faced off in the Final of the Basketball Africa League, with the Tripoli side getting a comfortable 88-67 win to claim their first title in Africa's strongest club competition.

It marked the end of an incredible journey for Alahli SC, as they played the Qualifying Rounds called the Road to BAL to even reach the group phase of the league. Once they got there, there was no looking back, storming to a 6-0 record against APR from Rwanda, MBB from South Africa and the Nairobi City Thunder from Kenya.

Alahli SC then dominated the 2025 BAL Playoffs, defeating Cabo Verde's Kriol Star in the Quarter-Finals, APR in the Semi-Finals, and Petro de Luanda in the championship game.

It was their first continental title, adding to the trophy cabinet which also contained eight Libyan championships, five cups and three Super Cups. Alahli SC are clearly a team which knows how to win, the FIBA Intercontinental Cup 2025 will give them their first taste of a global competition.

# FLAMENGO



The most successful club out of the six is ready to add another piece of silverware to their trophy cabinet. Flamengo are the two-time FIBA Intercontinental Cup champions, lifting the title in 2014 and 2022, while also playing the title game in 2019.

The Brazilian giants defeated Maccabi Tel Aviv across two games in 2014, were edged out by AEK from Athens five years later, despite enjoying the home court advantage in Rio de Janeiro, and then finished on top of the podium in 2022 again, taking down the Spanish side Hereda San Pablo Burgos in the Final in Cairo, Egypt.

Aside from being successful on a global stage, Flamengo are the record holders with three BCL Americas titles to their name, including the most recent one in 2025, and if you scratch beneath the surface, you'll find one more South American Championship of Champions Clubs title from 1953 and one FIBA South American League, won in 2009.

The scarlet-black fans are used to winning and have witnessed an incredible 49 state championships in Rio de Janeiro and seven Brazilian NBB League trophies. Just by listing all these accolades, you get a picture of how big a club they really are.

They arrive in Singapore ready to repeat what their compatriots did in 2023. Sesi Franca made a buzzer-beating shot to win the first FIBA Intercontinental Cup held in Singapore, Flamengo will try to copy-paste that performance now.

# ILLAWARRA HAWKS



The word Illawarra derives from the Aboriginal word meaning “pleasant place near the sea.” The whole region is located south of Sydney, with most of the population living in the city of Wollongong. Aside from the location, weather and the pleasant place, they get to enjoy having the best basketball team in all of Australia.

The Illawarra Hawks were founded in 1979, and they are the only team which took part in every single NBL season from that year to today. They won it twice, in 2001 and 2025, and they have had a solid connection to the NBA over the recent years.

In 2019-20, a global superstar LaMelo Ball was a member of the Hawks, winning the Rookie of the Year award in the NBL, and solidifying his case for the 2020 NBA Draft, which saw him becoming the third pick.

Former Houston Rockets guard Aaron Brooks also wore Illawarra’s colors, as will JaVale McGee, the 37-year-old three-time NBA champion and an Olympic gold medalist with the United States in 2021. McGee signed with the Hawks for the season just ahead of the FIBA Intercontinental Cup.

The connections don’t end there. The head coach who orchestrated the championship win in 2025 is none other than Justin Tatum, Jayson’s father, who was also named the NBL Coach of the Year.

The Tasmania JackJumpers finished third last season, setting the bar for the Australian clubs in this competition. The Hawks, fittingly, are keen on flying over it.

The Rio Grande Valley Vipers and Lakeland Magic had a pair of third-place finishes in the FIBA Intercontinental Cup in 2022 and 2023, but the idea of having a select team from the League proved to be even better in 2024.

The NBA G League United, with well known players such as Keisei Tominaga and Juan Toscano-Anderson - a 2022 NBA champion with the Golden State Warriors - went on to reach the Final in Singapore last year.

They had upset the Tasmania JackJumpers in the Semi-Finals, beating the NBL champions by two points, but facing Unicaja in the Final proved to be too tough for the G League side.

The prospect of putting together players from the NBA G League remains intriguing in 2025, too, and the fans in the Singapore Indoor Stadium will surely take down notes because some of the players from this team will find their way to elite competitions all over the world.

Aside from the already mentioned stars of 2024, the NBA G League representative NBA G League Ignite brought current NBA players Ron Holland and Matas Buzelis, along with Izan Almansa, one of the most dominant players in FIBA Youth Events history, to Singapore in 2023. A unique team in the basketball universe, the NBA G League United will surely earn plenty of fans in September 2025, too.

The defending champions picked up an incredible number of trophies from February 2023 to today, winning the FIBA Intercontinental Cup last year, the BCL Europe twice, the Spanish Cup twice, and the Spanish Supercup once, making this the most successful run in the club's history.

The key was always coded as Ibon's Plan. Ibon is Ibon Navarro, the head coach and the mastermind of the project which saw them having 14 equally important players sharing the load of the season, and the core of the team being together for more than two years.

In today's market it was impossible to keep all the stars, as last season's FIBA Intercontinental Cup MVP Dylan Osetkowski left the club, but the new players arriving in Malaga have all impressed in various ways on various stages.

The most interesting part of this event would be seeing those new guys in action. To single out one player in a team-first oriented club sounds like a tricky task, the Spaniards are excited to find out what Chris Duarte brings to them.

The 28-year-old shooter was the 13th pick in the 2021 NBA Draft, and the FIBA Intercontinental Cup marks the beginning of his European chapter, after he had played in nearly 200 NBA games with the Indiana Pacers, Sacramento Kings and Chicago Bulls.

# UTSUNOMIYA BREX



You can search far and wide, but it's hard to find such a fast development as with the winners of the Basketball Champions League Asia. Utsunomiya Brex only appeared in 2007, and by 2025, they collected three major trophies, including their first continental championship.

Based in Tochigi Prefecture in Japan, Brex take great pride in wearing the same colors as the Indiana Pacers. It started as a tribute to the sister state of Indiana, USA, but the team went on to even adopt a similar style of play as Tyrese Haliburton and his teammates.

Although they are still a young club, they already have a walking legend on their roster. D.J. Newbill turned 33 in May and celebrated his birthday by picking up the MVP award in the Japanese B.League – for the second time in a row, too – and also the MVP of the BCL Asia competition.

He scored 29 against Tabiat from Iran in the Quarter-Finals, 34 against the Ulaanbaatar Xac Broncos from Mongolia in the Semi-Finals, and 21 in the title game against Al Riyadi Beirut Club, including the championship-winning three-pointer with 30 seconds remaining.

All these games were firecrackers, Utsunomiya won 94-93, 93-71, and 94-93 again, respectively. Expect them in sixth gear start to finish in Singapore, too.

### MEDIA SERVICES

### GUIDELINES FOR ACCREDITED MEDIA

- With the exception of the host broadcaster and rights holders, media are not allowed to take digital or video footage of the games or the court.
- The court (Field of Play) and team benches are restricted areas and not open to media.
- Media personnel and equipment must not obstruct the view or movement of, or cause confusion for referees, players or coaches.
- Seating in the Media Tribune is available to journalists only.
- There will be a live feed of all games in the Media Centre.
- Non-rights holders will only be allowed to film the following:
  - o Post-game interviews at the Mixed Zone
  - o Victory ceremony
  - o Press conference after the Final game
- Photography taken by accredited photographers may be published (including online) for editorial purposes only.

## GUIDELINES FOR ACCREDITED PHOTOGRAPHERS

- Accredited photographers can take photos from the photo benches around the court. These positions are offered on a first come, first served basis.
- Under no circumstances should photographers venture behind the team benches or on the court at any stage, before, during or after the game.
- Photographers are kindly requested to not mark or add self-made stickers to reserve positions at the photo benches.
- Photographers must take their position before the game starts and cannot move during the game. Movement is allowed only during the half time interval.
- Photographers can shoot from the stands but should be mindful not to obstruct the view of spectators and Host Broadcasting cameras.
- Photographers cannot film any match action inside the Singapore Indoor Stadium at all times. Live-streaming of games is prohibited.
- Photographers should be mindful of their camera equipment positioning to ensure the safety of participants and surrounding spectators.
