

Accreditation Terms & Conditions – Guests & Accompanying Persons (Non-Players)

1.1 Purpose and scope

These Accreditation Terms & Conditions (“**Terms**”) apply to any individual who is not a player and who requests, receives, holds, uses, or wears an official accreditation for the FIBA Masters Open Hellas 2026 (the “**Competition**”), including guests, accompanying persons, delegates, and other non-player attendees (each an “**Accredited Person**”).

By accepting, holding, using, displaying, and/or wearing the accreditation, the Accredited Person acknowledges that they have read, understood and agree to be bound by these Terms.

1.2 Accreditation rules and venue access

1. Personal and non-transferable: Accreditation is personal, remains the property of FIBA (or the event organiser/host acting on FIBA’s behalf), and is non-transferable.
2. Conditional access: Accreditation grants access only to the areas and for the times corresponding to the category printed/encoded on the badge and may be subject to capacity and operational constraints.
3. Display requirement: Accredited Persons must wear and visibly display their accreditation at all times in controlled areas and present it on request.
4. Security checks: Entry and continued access may be subject to identity checks and security screening.
5. Compliance: Accredited Persons must comply with all applicable venue rules, safety instructions, medical/logistical procedures and event policies issued for the Competition.

1.3 Conduct and Regulatory Framework

Accredited Persons must behave respectfully and follow instructions from event staff, officials, security, medical personnel, and venue management. FIBA may refuse entry or revoke accreditation for misconduct or non-compliance. This mirrors the event-wide requirement to comply with the Competition’s applicable rules and guidelines, including, but not limited to, the FIBA General Statutes, the Internal Regulations and the Masters Handbook (the “**Regulatory Framework**”).

1.4 Image, audio and media (recording & use of likeness)

1. Event recording notice: The Competition and surrounding activities may be recorded and/or photographed (including live broadcast, streaming, highlights, and promotional content).
2. Use of image/likeness: By entering the venue and/or using the accreditation, the Accredited Person grants FIBA and its authorised partners an irrevocable, worldwide and royalty-free right to capture and use the Accredited Person’s image, likeness and voice in connection with the Competition for sporting, informational, promotional, commercial and/or broadcasting purposes, in any media, without limitation in time.
3. Accredited Person recordings: Any filming/photography by the Accredited Person must comply with venue rules and any restrictions applicable to accredited areas (e.g.,

limitations on professional equipment or use of footage). FIBA remains the exclusive owner of the Competition's relevant audiovisual/media rights.

1.5 Data protection ([privacy notice summary](#))

1. Data processed: For accreditation and event operations, FIBA (and/or its service providers/organiser) may process personal data such as name, contact details, country, date of birth (where required for identification), accreditation category, photo, access logs, and security/incident records.
2. Purposes: Administration of accreditation; identity verification; access control; safety/security; operational communications; compliance and incident management; and production of Competition-related content (including images/videos as above).
3. Sharing: Data may be shared on a need-to-know basis with authorised partners and service providers (e.g., accreditation system providers, venue security, event medical/logistics) and authorities where legally required.
4. Retention: Data is retained only as long as necessary for the above purposes and applicable legal obligations.
5. Rights: The Accredited Person may have rights to access, correction, deletion, objection/restriction, and portability, subject to applicable law. Requests can be made via the contact point set out below.

1.6 Health, safety, risk and liability

Accredited Persons acknowledge that attendance at a sports event involves inherent risks (e.g., crowd movement, accidental contact, ball impact, slips/trips). Accredited Persons agree to follow all safety instructions and accept such risks to the extent permitted by law.

1.7 Revocation, withdrawal and misuse

FIBA may deny issuance, deactivate, withdraw, or confiscate accreditation at any time, including for:

- providing false information;
- misuse, transfer, or attempt to access unauthorised areas;
- breach of these Terms, venue rules, or instructions;
- safety/security reasons or operational necessity.

If accreditation is withdrawn, the Accredited Person must leave controlled areas immediately.

1.8 Jurisdiction and disputes

Any dispute arising in connection with accreditation and attendance is subject to the dispute resolution approach applicable to the Competition and the Regulatory Framework.
